

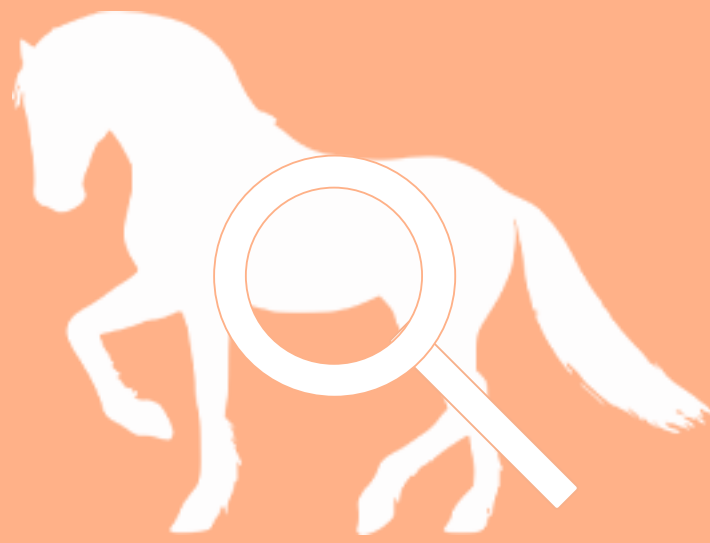

# Colic

## Symptoms

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- + Restlessness = rolling, sweating, trembling, upper lip curl (flehm)
- + Missing defecation, in some cases diarrhea
- + Often no interest in feed or water
- + Lack or absence of sounds of bowel movement
- + Apathy
- + Various ways of stretching, kicking and looking towards the stomach.
- + Increased pulse and respiration
- + Changed color of mucosal membranes
- + Cold extremities (e.g. Ears)





# Colic

## Measures

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- + Call the vet immediately
- + If the horse isn't rolling in an uncontrollable manner putting itself and others in danger, try to walk it until the vet arrives.
- + Avoid walking the horse with a pulse over 60 bpm
- + Take note of when the horse last ate, was seen drinking and whether it has been defecating or urinating.
- + In cold weather: keep the horse warm by using a rug
- + If possible measure temperature (Pay attention to your own safety)
- + If the horse has diarrhea, maintain good hygiene for yourself, other horses and people. (Danger of bacteria and/or parasites)
