

## Eye injury Symptoms

Changed behavior, e.g. easily frightened, walks into things, changed head posture

Lacrimation

 Puffy eyes or squinting of the eyelids
(lower pointing of eye lashes on the affected eye)

Red conjunctiva and sclera

Touch- and lightsensitivity

Color change or perhaps visible injury in the eye

Changed size of the eye





Eye injury Measures

Examine the eye, call your vet and tell about the abnormalities.
If there is visible injury or a change in behavior or vision, move the horse to a dark

stall and remove objects that could cause further damage to the eye. If the horse is calm enough, it can be tethered to avoid risking further damage to the eye.

If possible, remove foreign bodies if these are located in the surrounding tissues of the eye.

Do not commence any medical treatment without the vets consent.

Do not attempt flushing, rinsing or treating the eye before having the consent from a vet.
