

Emergency cards Heatstroke





- Instability, staggering
- Heavy breathing (flank movement)
- Increased sweating
- Characterised by an increased temperature of at least over 35.6°F.





Heatstroke Measures

- Lead horse into the shade or another cooler environment
- Notify vet
- Apply an ice pack or wrap to the head
- terward. Letting the horse walk into cold water such as a stream or small lake provides convection of the heat wich is an effective way for the horse to cool down.

Cool down horse with wet cloths or cold

- Offer plenty of water to prevent dehydration from sweating.
- Do not administer anti-pyretic drugs
- Rule out poisoning as the cause for the hyperthermia
